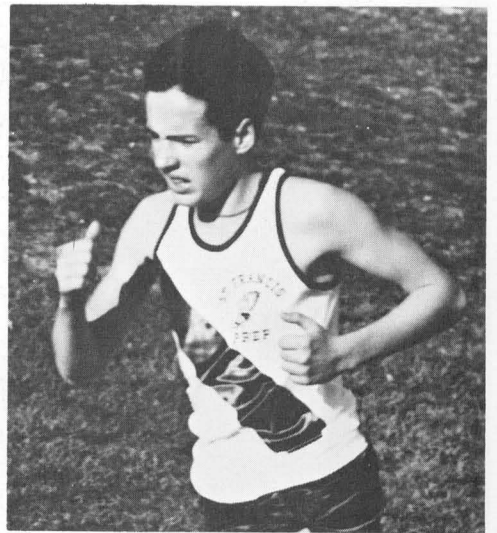


Mark Mirski, number one among the Prep Runners, displays the form that won him first place in numerous meets.

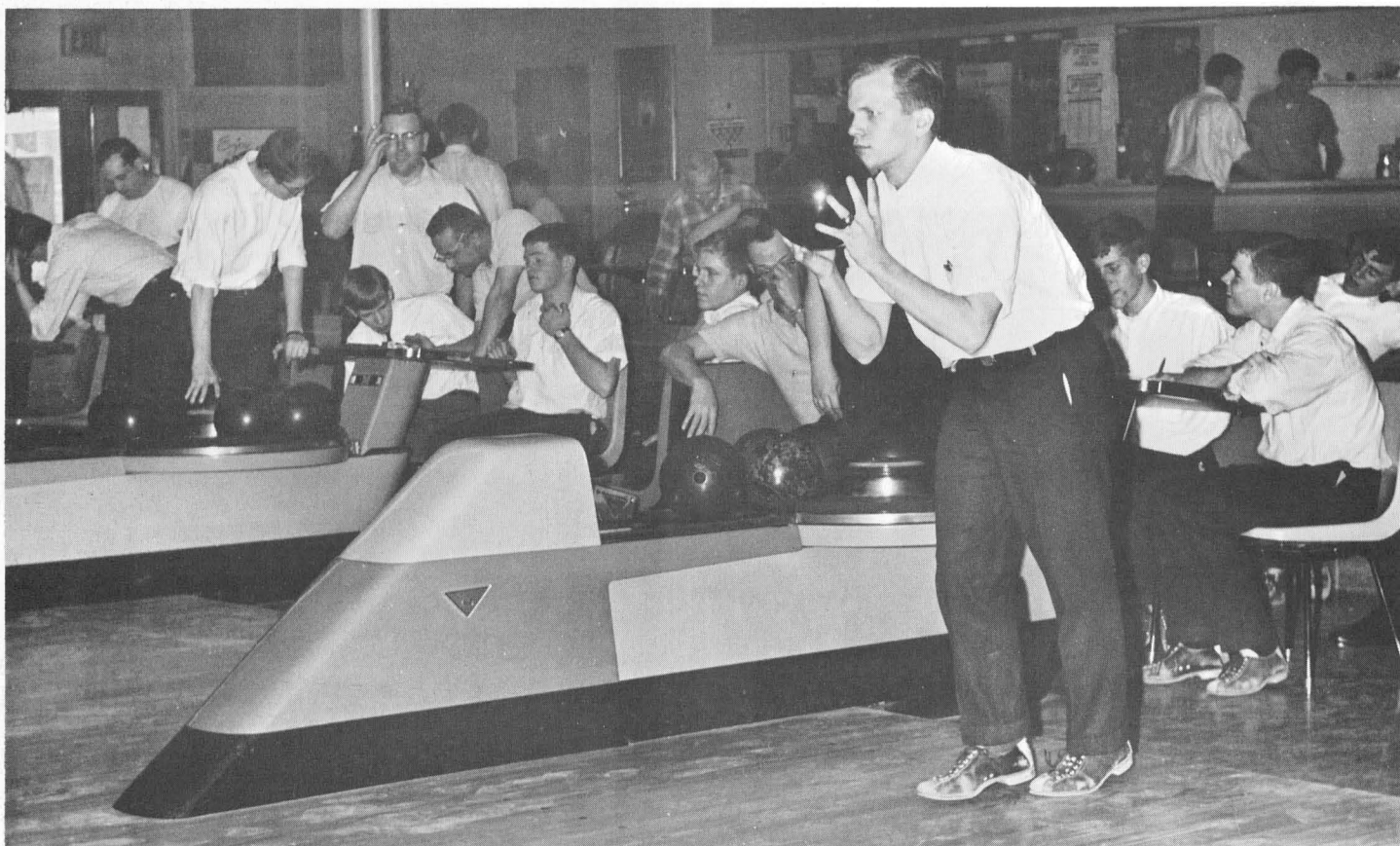
Steve Maroney, a junior, looked good in several cross-country runs. Hard working, diligent Steve is the heir apparent to Mark M's place.

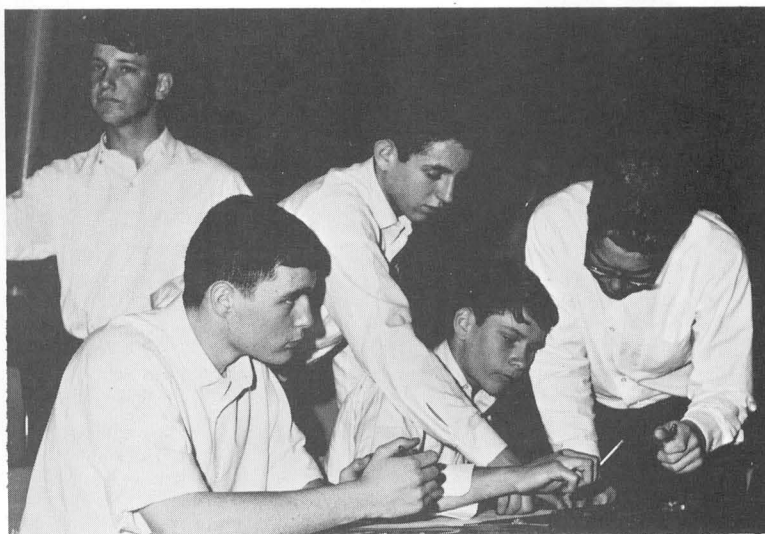

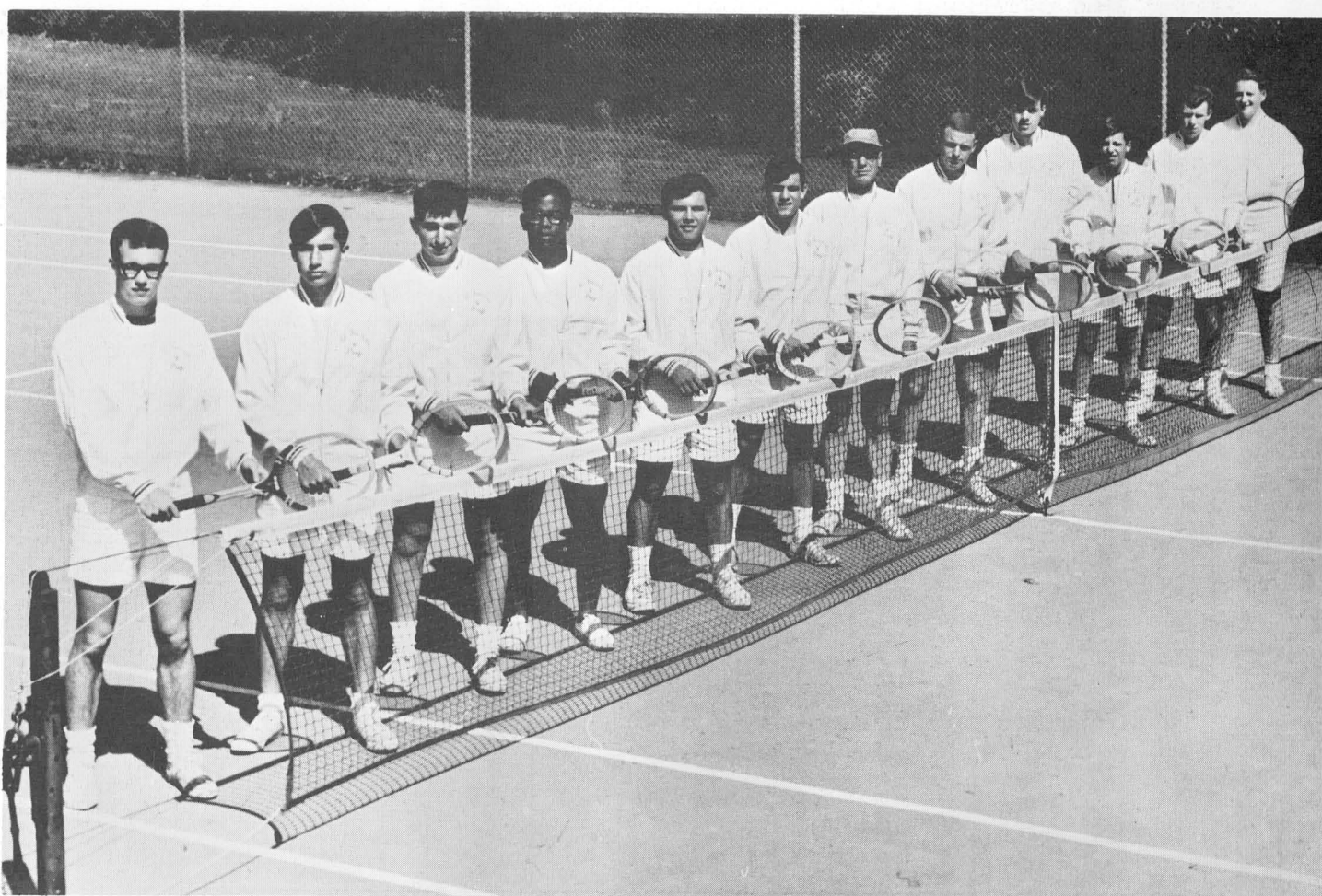


A. Barry, team captain, shows superb form as he backhands a shot.

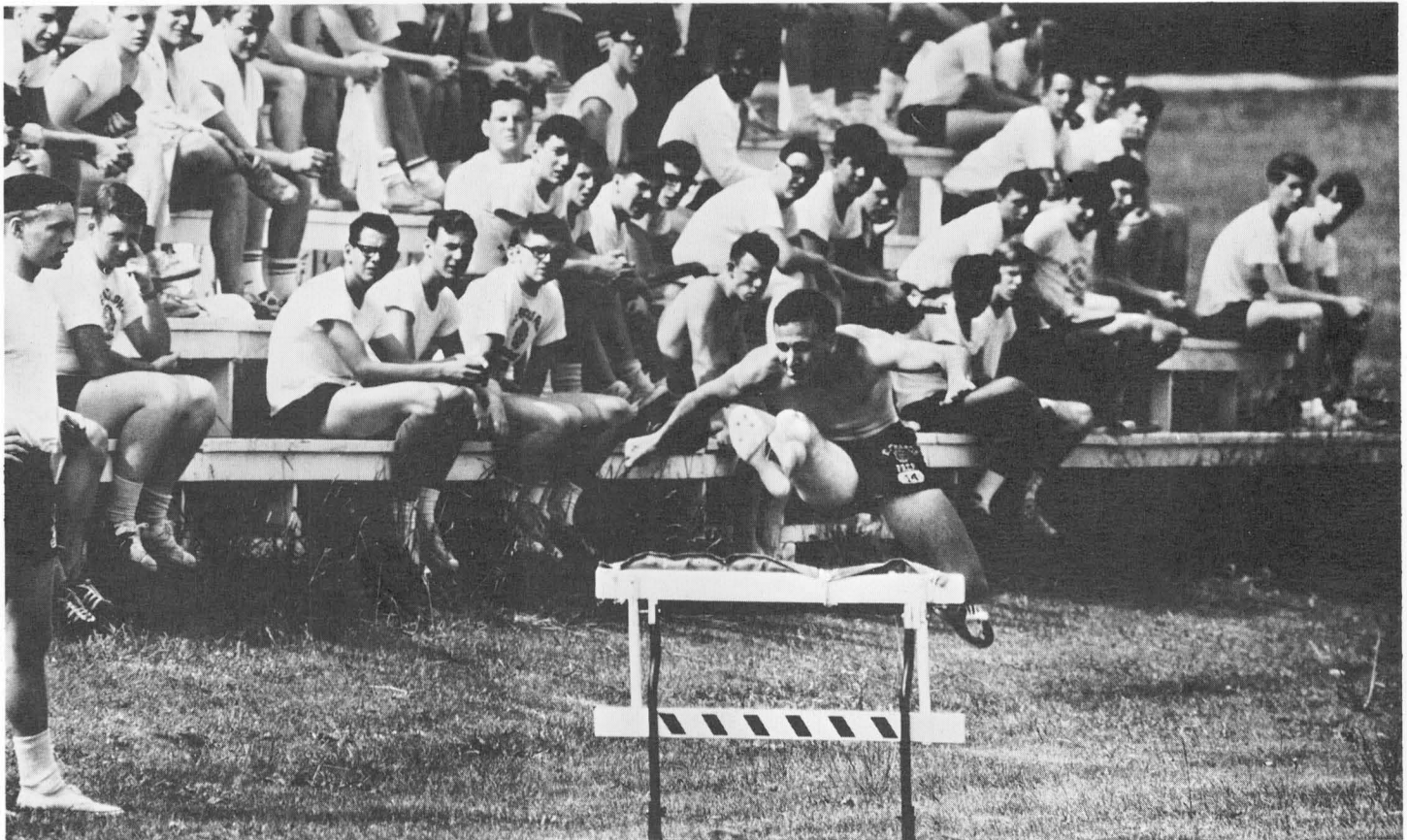

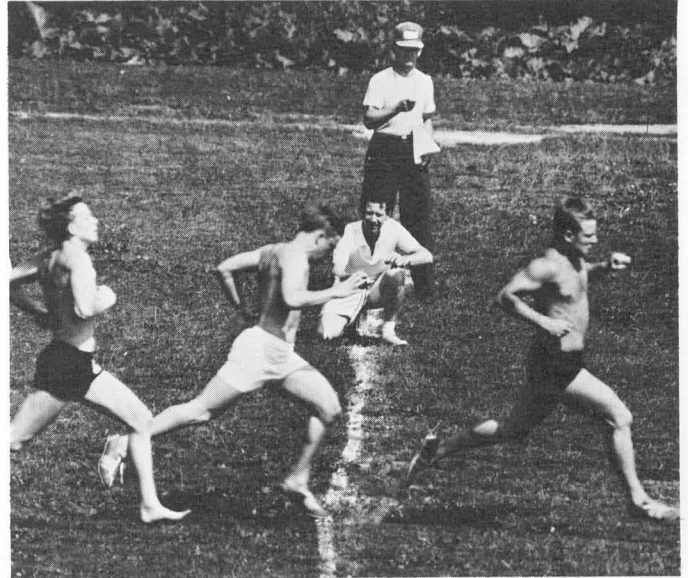
T. Murtha shows his exceptional ability at the hurdles, each Prepster signs up for three events; when not participating he rests as a most interested spectator.

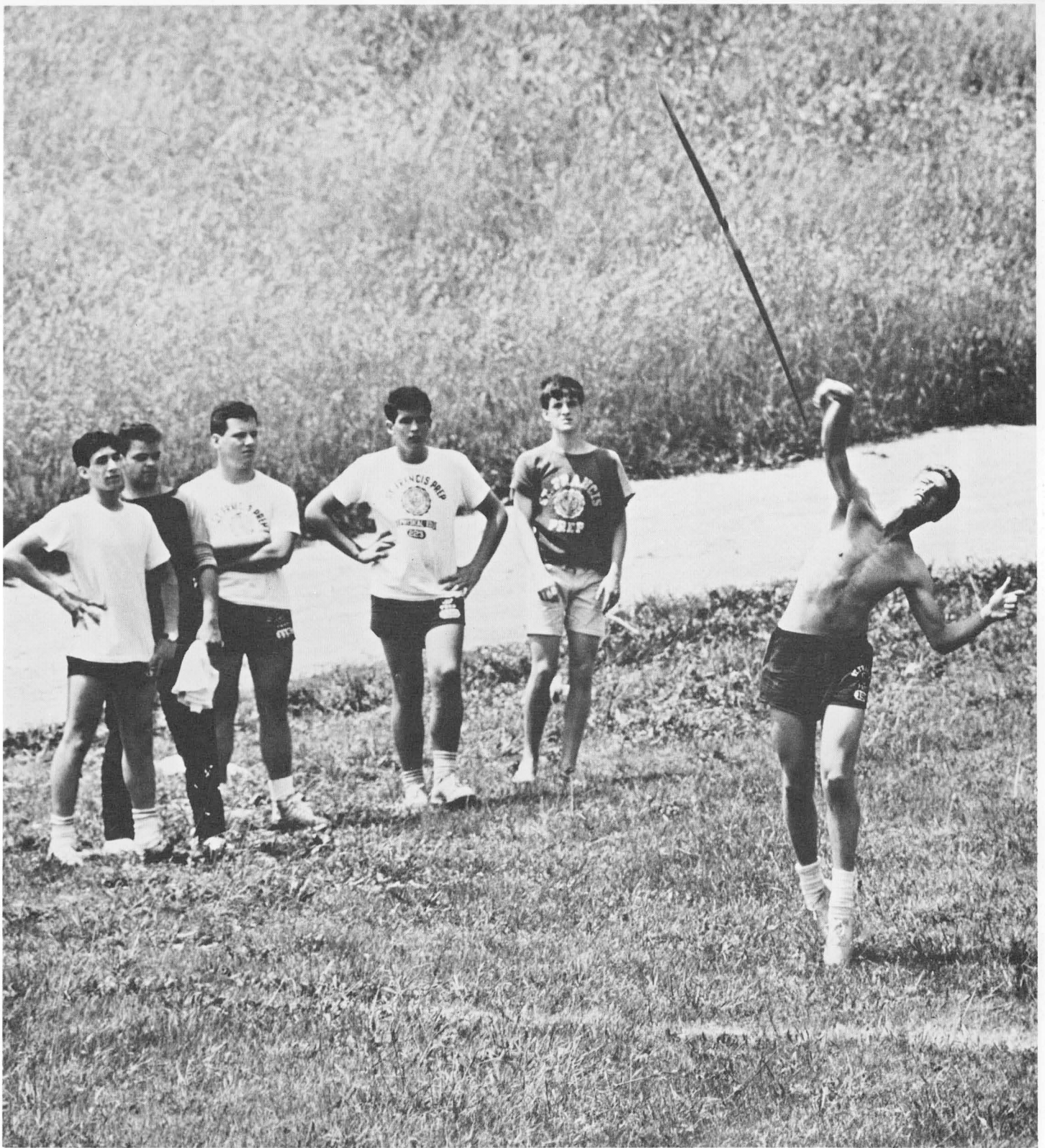

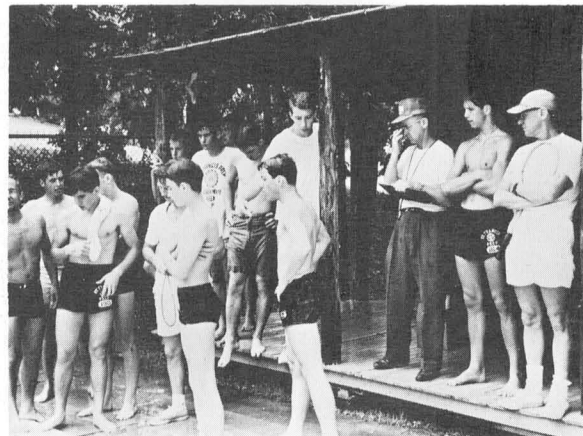


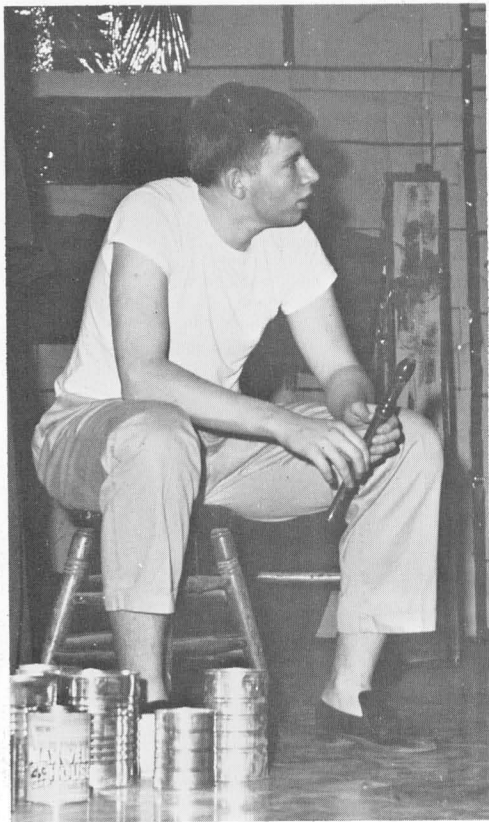


A. Wright shows good form and appears to have a good throw with the javelin — the other participants wait their turn.

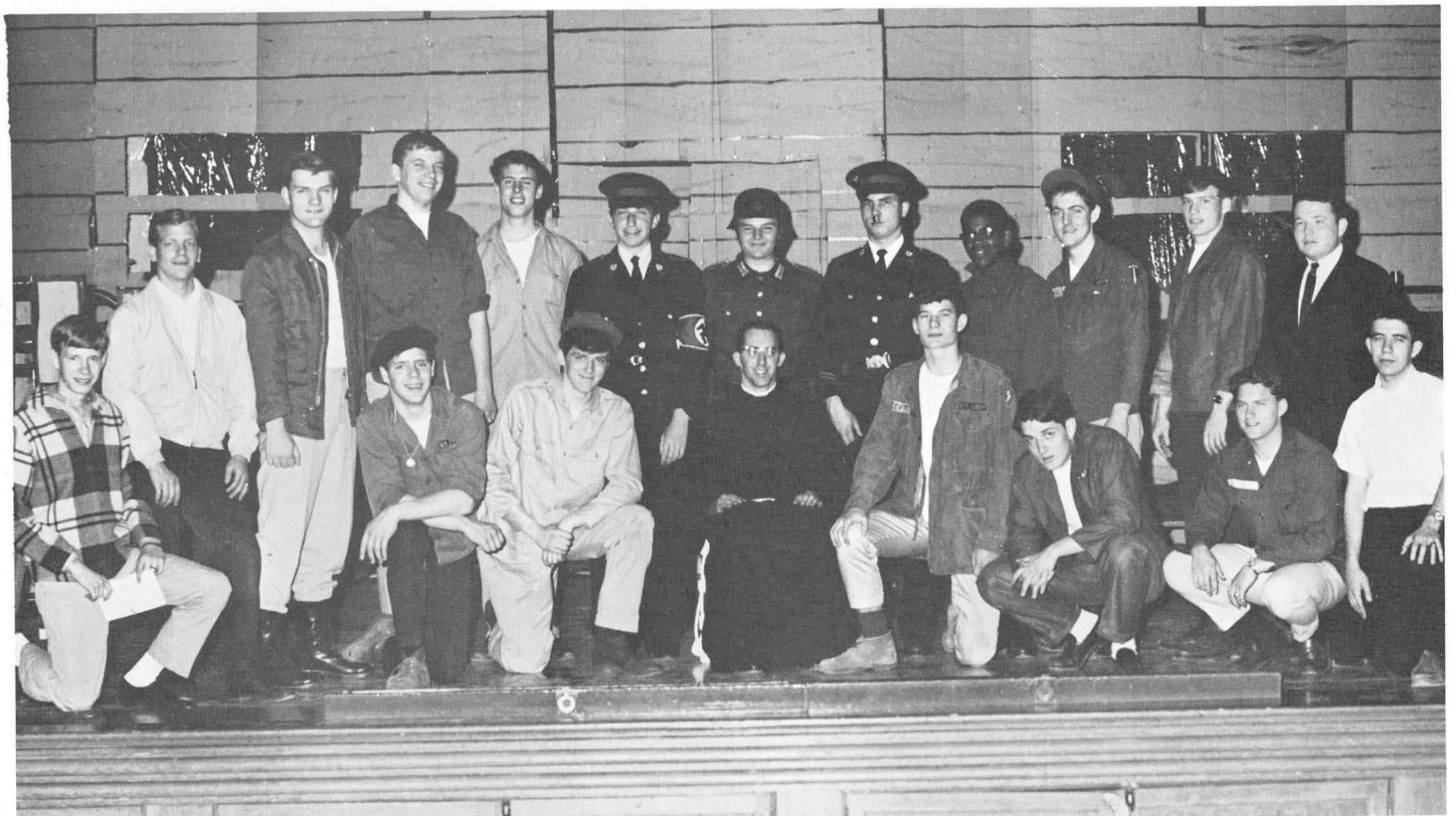

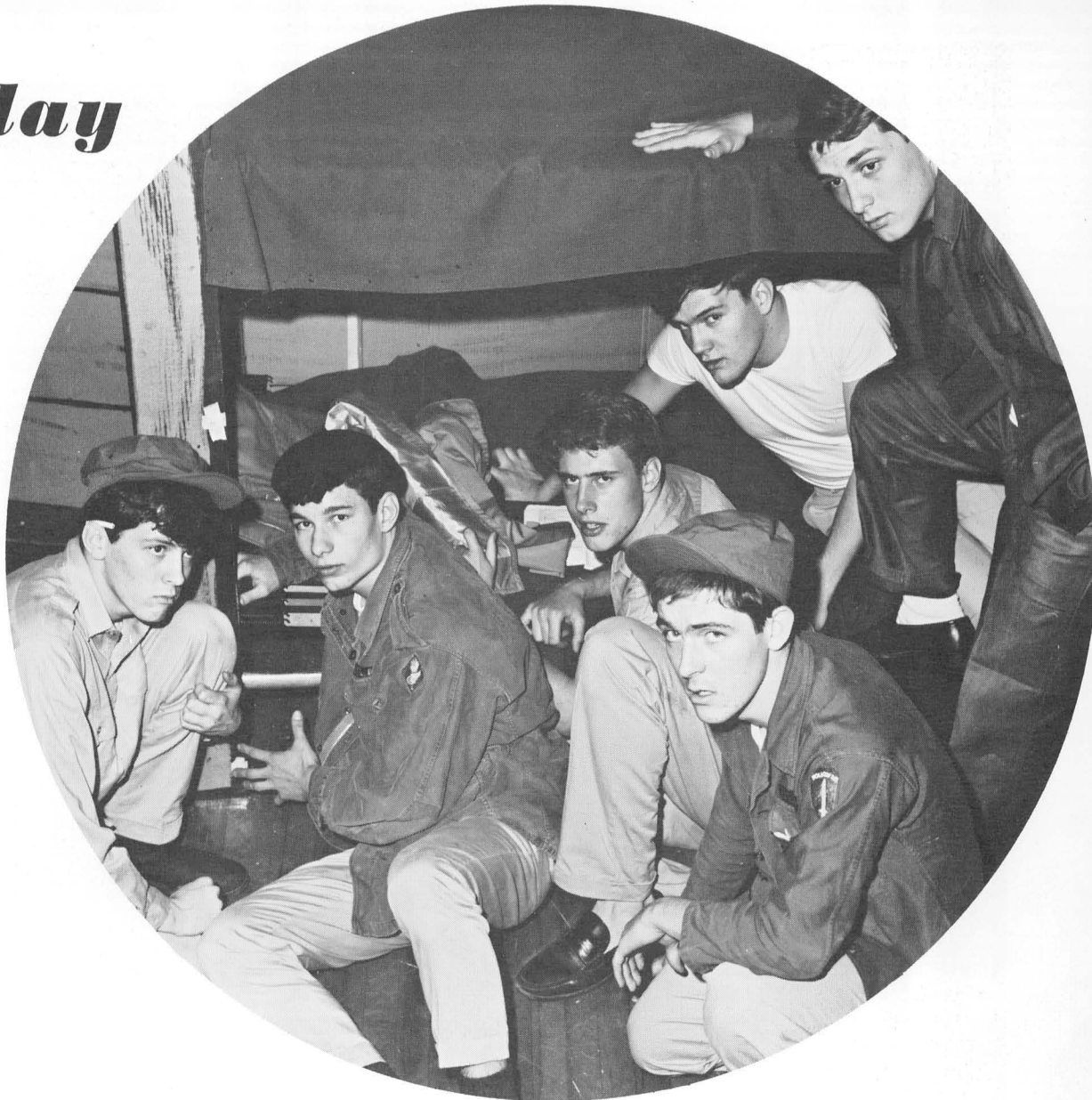


All eyes and ears are focused on the stage as the thespians performed "Stalag 17."

# The Play

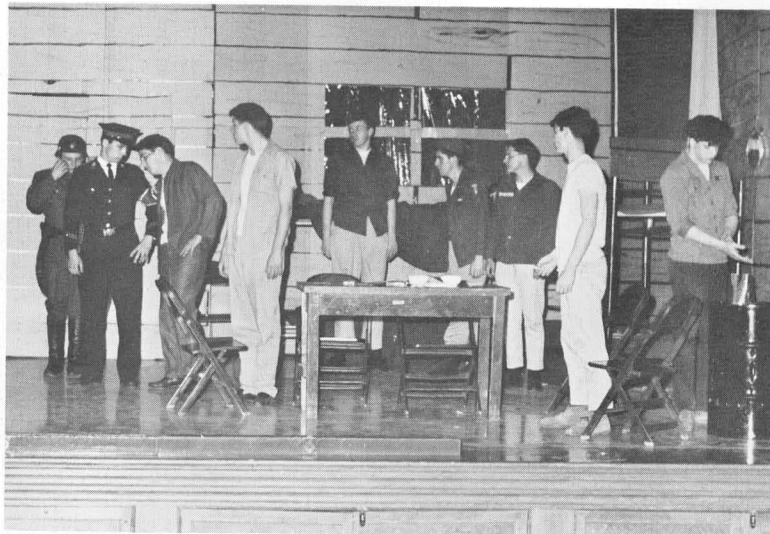

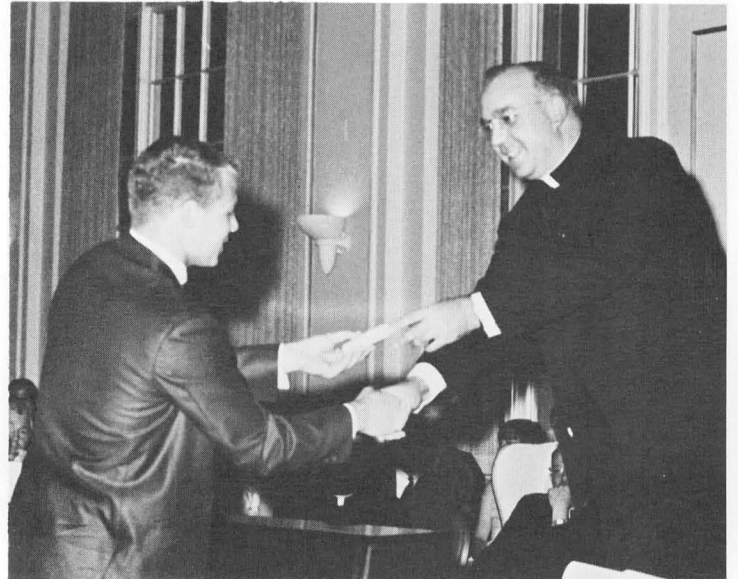
## Awards Night

As a token of our gratitude to His Excellency we gave him a Spiritual Bouquet; Father Headmaster made the presentation.

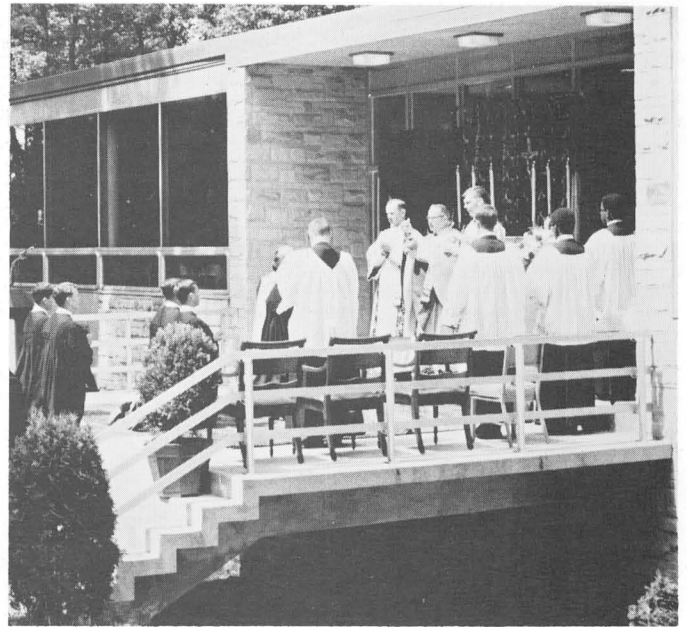

To the delight of all, the Best Dressed Award went to Frank Fazio. Whether on the field, the hardwood or just lounging around "Fazz" was always neat.



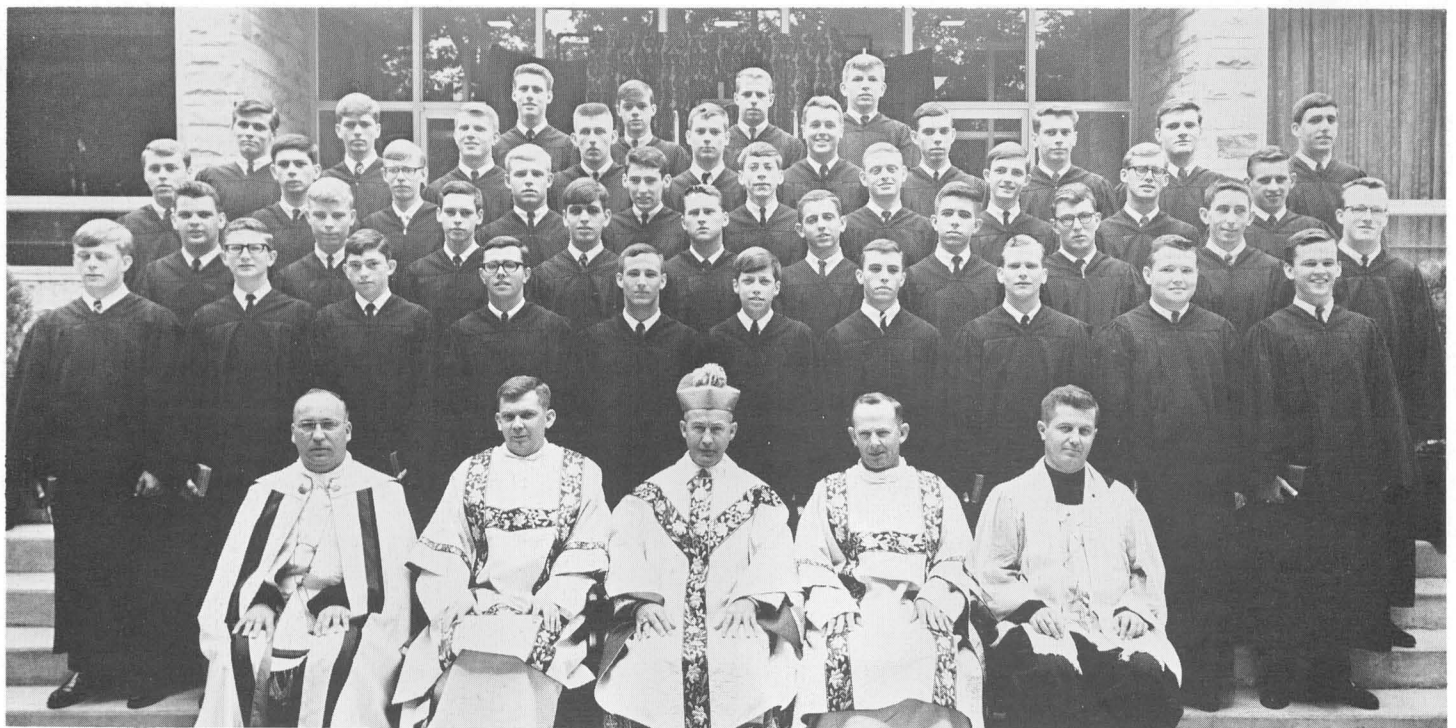
